On November 17, 2013, and for many days afterwards, a little brother in our program, Davyon Edmundson, demonstrated his strength, courage, maturity and how to be a true 'big brother'. It was on this date that his younger brother, Donovan, was struck by a hit-and-run van near his after-school program and seriously injured. Davyon was

close by, as was his mother Martine and they were rushed with Donovan to the Westchester Medical Center Intensive Care Unit where doctors worked to save his life.

Donovan, after a lengthy stay in the hospital and at home, is now doing better and back in school.

While there are many accomplishments I could list for Davyon, who has been with me for almost six years, the one his family and I are most proud of will always be how he handled himself during this extremely traumatic and difficult time.

Davyon gave up all of his activities and free time that a typical 12 ½ year old has, so he could spend time with his mother at the hospital, keeping Donovan's spirits high. That continued once Donovan was brought home for a lengthy stay, rushing home after school to make sure Donovan was okay and keeping up with his schoolwork as he recovered. This also included helping his mom out around the house in other ways as well allowing her to focus her attention and care on Donovan while still going to work. He continues to keep watch over Donovan today, reminding him of any limitations still in place that will help ensure a full recovery.

He was and remains, even months later, always there for Donovan (and his mom) and is looking forward to when Donovan is 100% again!
